Message from our Founders

We founded New Routes in December 2019, in response to a deep conviction we both had to help the orphaned and vulnerable in Kenya. There are an estimated 2.4 million orphans in Kenya and in Elgeyo Marakwet County, where we work, over half the population live on less than £22 per month. Only 1.3% of all school students go on to complete a university degree in this county, so for orphans, there is really little hope.

NEW ROUTES is here to help change that. Our holistic programmes offer the skills and tools necessary for our beneficiaries to create New Routes and break generational cycles of poverty.

This being our second year of operation, we are ecstatic to see how much change our programmes have been able to bring to our beneficiaries, their families, and even their communities. Where hope was once lost, it has now been found. This impact report gives an insight into what this past year of operation looked like and what we look forward to in the coming ones.
